### Challenging Slavery in the Chesapeake: Black and White ...

When the War of 1812 came in full force to the Chesapeake Bay region, it created new opportunities for slaves who wanted to flee with the British to freedom. During April 1814 Admiral Alexander F. I. Cochrane issued a bold proclamation freeing enslaved people who joined the British cause; this was similar to Lord Dunmore’s attempt to mobilize Virginia blacks during the American Revolution.

□Chesapeake was a marginal market for transatlantic slave traders. □Throughout the seventeenth century, the scarcity of direct deliveries rendered it difficult for Virginians and Marylanders to obtain slaves. □Access perhaps even more important than price in shaping patterns of slave ownership.

### Slavery in the Chesapeake

In the 1800s, the Chesapeake region became a focal point of the national controversy surrounding slavery because it was in the unique position of spanning free, border and slave states: “Free states,” which did not support slavery, made up the northern portion of the region. “Slave states” encompassed the southern portion of the region.
